The technology audit provides an avenue for companies to assess their technology management capabilities as well as understanding their individual strengths and weaknesses as well as potential areas for improvement.

Subsequent to the technology audit, 374 projects on technology uptake have been approved and more than 1,069 companies have participated in other technology intervention projects such as energy audit, packaging and labelling, innovation workshop as well as adoption of best practices.
